I. CALL TO ORDER

Director Roberts called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

II. ESTABLISH QUORUM

A quorum was established. Also present were the above-referenced staff and consultants.

III. PUBLIC COMMENT

No public comments were received.

IV. CONSENT AGENDA

A. Approve minutes of December 18, 2017 regular Board Meeting.

B. Approve payment of outstanding invoices and other related bookkeeping matters.

Director Walden clarified that of the \$47,000 check for Lloyd Gosselink, \$13,000 is for SER review.

- C. Approve Contractor Pay Requests including:
 - 1. Raw Water Intake Expansion & Rehabilitation Project, Payton Construction, Inc., \$25,926.00.
- D. Approve Service Extension Requests (SERs) including location maps for:
 - 1. Anthem at Ledgestone Apartments, 67 Water LUEs, 290 System.
- E. Approve 70% developer reimbursement for Highpointe Section 5.3, \$438,600.04.
- F. Authorize General Manager up to \$200,000 to expedite purchase and replacement of two pressure control valves for Raw Water Pump Nos. 4 and 5.

Director Goff asked if this item was already budgeted for and stated that the wording wasn't clear. Mr. Cantu stated that this item needs to be expedited due to necessary replacements and lead time in ordering and it is a budgeted item.

MOTION: A motion was made by Director Roberts to approve F of the Consent Agenda, provided as **Exhibit A**. The motion was seconded by Director Whisenant.

G. Approve Consent to Assignment of the Wholesale Water Service Agreement with Deer Creek Ranch Water Co., LLC to SJWTX, Inc.

Director Goodwin asked if this was a true purchase and transfer or a name change, to which Ms. Albright stated that this is a new company purchasing the system. The Board discussed the payment history of Deer Creek and asked PUA staff to convey to SJWTX the concern that the customer's account be current through the process of approval at the PUC.

V. STAFF REPORTS

A. General Manager's Report.

Mr. Pugh presented on this item, provided as **Exhibit G**. He stated that the TLAP amendment was filed with TCEQ on December 15, 2017.

Mr. Pugh stated that a tank painting program is in place, and one of the ground storage tanks was found with deterioration and will need to be demolished. He stated that Mr. Lozano had been consulted to include this as a component of the Capital Improvements Plan (CIP). Discussion ensued regarding maintenance of the tanks, and Mr. Lozano stated that the tank at issue had some direct plumbing of the supply line planned, but it's not clear if that was actually done. He stated that the maintenance was deferred for some time, including with the previous operator.

Director Walden asked for an elaboration relating to the manhole repair program, to which Mr. Pugh stated that several manholes in Lake Pointe seem to be deteriorating. CP&Y has determined that structural repair is needed for several manholes, and that currently they are looking at a structural liner to minimize cost and disturbance. He stated this process is set to begin in the summer.

Director Goodwin confirmed that the LCRA is considering increasing firm water rates, and asked whether LCRA had given any indication of whether the available water supply was being sold quickly. He asked Mr. Pugh to inquire on this issue at the next meeting with LCRA as the PUA will likely need to purchase more water in the future.

Director Goodwin stated that the PUA receives a lot of high volume complaints and that he does look into some of these complaints. He stated that there had been issues retrieving data logs for some customers, and he had worked with Mr. Pugh and Ms. Riechers to contact local utilities as

to whether they had similar issues. Director Goodwin stated that Lakeway MUD has meters that are all less than 5 years old, whereas the PUA has up to 15-year old meters and the data log retrieval may be an issue with battery power. He stated that Mr. Pugh is putting together a plan to address this issue. Director Goff stated that the meters in his neighborhood are in manholes and it is not always practical for the customer to read the meters.

Mr. Pugh stated that staff is looking at the potential for new office space to incorporate both the Administrative office with the Customer Service office. Director Whisenant stated that the PUA may also want to look into the option of ownership of facilities. Director Roberts asked if any locations had been looked at in Hays County to which Mr. Pugh answered that they had not. Mr. Pugh stated that the leasing price is approximately \$20-\$26 per square foot in Bee Cave. He confirmed that he would be looking for direction from the Board in the coming months, and that approximately 5,000 square feet would be needed, with parking considerations for both staff and for customers.

B. Controller's Report.

Ms. Smith presented this item, provided as **Exhibit H**, stating that the PUA is on-track with revenue. She stated that there are some items paid early, but all were expected and budgeted expenses.

C. Engineer's Report.

1. Capital Improvements Plan Update.

The engineer's report was provided as **Exhibit I**. Mr. Lozano gave an update on the permitting process for the Southwest Parkway Pump Station expansion project.

Director Whisenant asked if the ground storage tank can't be built, what other option would be possible? Mr. Lozano stated that this ground storage needs to be built to provide reliable capacity. He stated that if Chapter 245 status was denied by the City of Austin, the PUA will have to go through the full permitting process with the City that may involve more political issues. Director Walden stated that if they get to that process the PUA may want to look for legal assistance.

Director Goff asked for an update regarding Raw Waterline No. 2. Mr. Lozano stated that the clearing won't be able to happen in February before the nesting season as the PUA still needs to get a site development permit from the City of Bee Cave. He stated that there is anticipation of an October 1 construction start date when the warbler nesting season is closed.

Director Goodwin asked about the intermingling of the Backyard and Terrace review, and Ms. Coker stated that those plans had been submitted together. Director Goodwin asked that these be considered as two independent projects as this is how Bee Cave is looking at these projects.

D. Operations Report.

This report was provided by Mr. Cantu, and provided as **Exhibit J**.

Mr. Cantu stated that the effluent ponds had reached a 75% level and that the golf courses would be notified. He stated that the golf courses had been very cooperative with these requests.

VI. OLD BUSINESS

At 11:06 a.m., Director Roberts announced that the Board would convene in executive session to consult with its attorney under Texas Government Code 551.071 regarding Item VI.A.

At 11:33 a.m., Director Roberts announced that the Board would convene in open session and that no action had been taken in executive session.

This item was discussed in executive session.

B. Discuss, consider and take action regarding the Series 2013 Bonds refinancing and related matters.

Mr. Kimball presented a summary of the refunding bond issuance and stated that the deal had already closed. He reminded the Board that federal tax legislation would close the window for advanced refunding bonds, and the Board quickly authorized the consultants to proceed with the refunding if it fell within certain parameters. He stated that Standard & Poor gave the PUA an upgraded rating and a positive outlook which will bode well for future issuances. Mr. Kimball stated that when the bonds went to market there was a lot of issuances, but as an A offering with a higher return, the PUA issuance was more than ten times oversold with \$1.5 billion in orders. Originally the savings was estimated at \$9.25 million in debt service reduction, when \$17.4 million was actually realized, with over \$600,000 per year in savings seen over a 30-year period.

Director Roberts thanked staff and Mr. Kimball for the work on this issuance.

C. Discuss, consider and take action on easement for John Carrell Property for 1340 Transmission Main Project.

Mr. Klein presented on this item stating that there has been some progress and a line of communication opened, but no action is needed.

VII. NEW BUSINESS

A. Discuss, consider and take action regarding amendment to PUA water service policy to include additional water service area (CCN) to serve the Preserve at Oak Hill.

Mr. Klein stated that there is a proposal, provided as **Exhibit K**, to slightly expand the service area of the PUA. He stated that the tract at issue is in both the City of Austin and PUA CCN, and the City has agreed to transfer the CCN to the PUA. However, this portion of the land to be transferred is outside of the PUA's designated service area. He stated that the amendment requested is that the water service area include the PUA's CCN, as amended.

Director Goodwin asked if it's necessary to amend the CCN. Mr. Klein stated that this amendment is needed by law as the area at issue is in Austin's CCN, and the PUA can't serve in their CCN.

MOTION: A motion was made by Director Goodwin to approve the

amendments to the PUA water service policy, provided as **Exhibit**

<u>K</u>. The motion was seconded by Director Walden.

The West Travis County Public Utility Agency (WTCPUA) has completed its review of requested water service for the subject project. Service Availability for eleven (11) LUEs of water allocation is approved subject to the Applicant complying with the Service Extension Request (SER) Conditions below:

SER CONDITIONS

- 1. The Applicant enters into a Non-Standard Water Service Agreement with the PUA for eleven (11) LUEs of water service within three (3) months of the date of the letter.
- 2. The Applicant completes the review process of technical plans associated with its proposed development, including submitting plans that meet PUA requirements for approval prior to release for construction. The Applicant shall also be required to pay all engineering review fees, legal fees and inspection fees associated with this process.
- 3. The Applicant constructs, at Applicant's sole cost and expense, all water service extensions of facilities necessary to facilitate retail service to the Property.
- 4. The PUA inspects and accepts the facilities per the approved construction plans and specifications.
- 5. The Applicant, at its sole cost and expense, grants to the PUA all on-site and off-site easements necessary for the PUA to own and operate the facilities in a form and manner acceptable to the PUA.
- 6. Prior to release of water meters for the Property, the applicant shall submit close out documents including final plat and executed and recorded easements per the attached list, as well as an executed Conveyance Agreement.

- 7. Customers applying for service in the Property will have to pay all fees including connection fees, impact fees per LUE, and meter drop in fees.
- 8. Applicant shall pay the PUA annual Water Reservation Fees as applicable per PUA Tariff.
- 9. The Applicant shall follow and comply with all applicable PUA Tariff, policies, rules and regulations pertaining to water service, as amended from time to time by the WTCPUA Board of Directors.
- 10. The Applicant will be required to secure a Legal Lot Determination from Hays County or secure an approved subdivision plat in Hays County, Texas for the Property within four (4) years from the date of this letter.
- 11. Provisions of water to the Property by the PUA shall become null and void if final construction plans have not been approved by the PUA for the Project within four (4) years from the date of this letter.
- 12. The Applicant shall adopt one of the alternative water quality measures required of the new development as specified in that certain "Memorandum of Understanding" between the LCRA and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), dated May 24, 2000 (MOU) and the "Settlement Agreement and Stipulation of Dismissal" from the lawsuit, Hays County Water Planning Partnership, et. al. vs. Lt. General Robert B. Flowers, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Thomas E. White, Secretary of the Army, Gale Norton, Secretary of the Department of the Interior, and the Lower Colorado River authority, W.D. Tex. 2002 (No. AOOCA 826SS) (Settlement Agreement) including:
 - a. Measures approved by the USFWS through separate Section 7 consultation, or other independent consultation:
 - b. TCEQ optional enhanced measures, Appendix A and Appendix B to RG-348; or
 - c. U.S. Fish and wildlife Service Recommendations for Protection of Water Quality of the Edwards Aquifer dated September 1, 2000;

Please be advised that conditions may change over time and the PUA will not reserve or commit water capacity to the Property until all conditions listed above are met. If, for any reason, that system capacity is exceeded prior to connection to the system, then this property is subject to a moratorium of any additional connections which may be declared. Also, please be advised that the PUA will not provide direct fire flow service to the Property and, as such, the Applicant may be required to install and maintain fire service facilities needed to meet local fire code regulations and requirements.

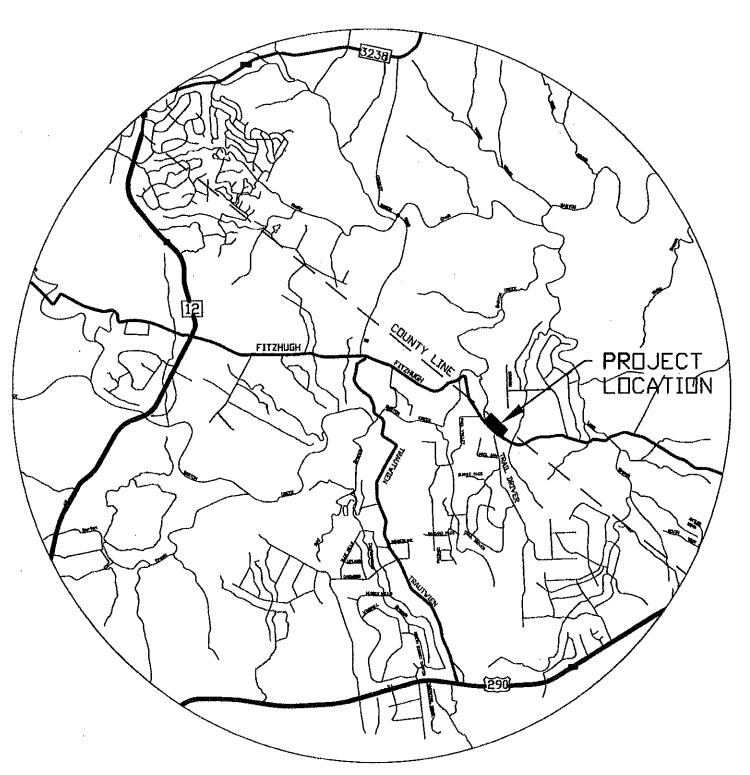

Utility Facilities Acquisition Agreement between the Lower Colorado River Authority and CCNG Development Company, L.P. dated November 19, 1999, as amended (the "UFAA"), and assigned Default Notice and Demand for Payment of \$581,021.37 in Reimbursable Costs for Spanish Oaks Section VIII

Gentlemen:

As you know, CCNG Development Company, L.P. ("CCNG") and the West Travis County Public Utility Agency ("WTCPUA") are parties to the referenced UFAA, originally between CCNG and the Lower Colorado River Authority ("LCRA") and fully assigned to the WTCPUA, on June 15, 2017. Pursuant to the UFAA, CCNG agreed to build at its own expense the required Internal Facilities to be located within the CCNG Tract, and then subsequently convey those Internal Facilities to the WTCPUA upon completion of the construction. The WTCPUA agreed to acquire and reimburse CCNG for the actual costs incurred by CCNG for the construction of the Internal Facilities in two (2) separate closings as follows: i) seventy percent (70%) of CCNG's costs would be reimbursed upon the conveyance of the facilities to the WTCPUA, and ii) the remaining thirty percent (30%) would be paid to CCNG when certain criteria are satisfied pursuant to Article 10.02 of the UFAA. The rights to collect these Reimbursable Costs are now owned by Synchro Realty, L.L.C. ("Synchro"), an affiliate of CCNG (collectively hereinafter referred to as the "CCNG Parties"). CCNG is acting as the authorized agent for Synchro in pursuing collection of these Reimbursable Costs owed.

This letter gives formal, written notice that a Default has occurred under the UFAA. Further, this represents the CCNG Parties Demand for the thirty percent (30%) portion of the Reimbursable Costs for the Internal Facilities constructed by the CCNG Parties relative to Spanish Oaks Section VIII, as outlined in Section 10.02 of the UFAA. The total amount currently owed to the CCNG Parties for the thirty percent (30%) portion of the Reimbursable Costs corresponding to Section VIII of the CCNG Tract is \$581,021.37. The CCNG Parties hereby demand payment in full for these Reimbursable Costs, as required pursuant to the UFAA.

Pursuant to the UFAA, the CCNG Parties constructed the Internal Facilities for Spanish Oaks Section VIII, and the LCRA accepted the conveyance of these Internal Facilities and paid the seventy percent (70%) portion of the Reimbursable Costs.

The closing date, the amount representing 100% of the Reimbursable Costs, 70% of the Reimbursable Costs already paid, and the amount representing the thirty (30%) portion of the Reimbursable Costs to be paid, plus interest, are set forth below.

The remaining thirty percent (30%) Reimbursable Costs were calculated from the audit report backups provided to CCNG, on February 14, 2012. The total amounts are derived from calculating thirty percent (30%) of the Eligible Costs and two (2) years of interest. A copy of the audit report backup is attached hereto as Exhibits B.

Pursuant to Section 10.02 (b) of the UFAA, the conditions required to cause the thirty percent (30%) portion of the Reimbursable Costs to be due have occurred. Section 10.02 (b) of the UFAA reads as follows:

"LCRA will reimburse CCNG for the remaining thirty percent (30%) of CCNG's Reimbursable Costs related to the same phase of the Internal Facilities within thirty (30) days, following an annual review of final tax appraisal values when both the following have occurred:

- (i) the CCNG Tract has an appraised value of land and improvements thereon equal to at least ten times the amount of capital expenditures made by LCRA for the design, engineering, permitting, construction and/or acquisition of those portions on a pro rata basis of the Regional Facilities and the Internal Facilities necessary to serve the CCNG Tract (this appraised value to capital expenditures ratio is intended to correlate to the ten-to-one assessed value to debt ratio contemplated by the Texas Administrative Code, title 30, section 293.47(a)(1)); and,
- (ii) eighty percent (80%) of all living unit equivalents ("LUEs") projected to be <u>served by any previously constructed phases</u> of the Treated Water Distribution System and the Wastewater Collection Facilities, purchased from CCNG by the LCRA, have connected to the System and are receiving retail water and wastewater service from the LCRA."

Both of these criteria have been satisfied as follows:

Appraised Value

- The total appraised value within Municipal Utility Districts No. 6 and No. 8 alone is \$714.7 million, as evidenced by the TCAD certified tax statements for 2017, which are included in Exhibit A attached hereto.
- According to the LCRA audit report, the total dollars spent on the Internal Facilities is \$12.7
- Despite multiple prior requests, we have not received from the LCRA or the WTCPUA the
 proposed allocation related to the total dollars spent on the Regional Facilities. Unless the
 WTCPUA can demonstrate that CCNG's pro rata share of the Regional Facilities exceeds \$58.8

million (based upon the 2017 certified values), the data outlined herein satisfies the conditions necessary for the remaining thirty percent (30%) to be due and payable under the UFAA.

Connectivity

The connectivity percentages by lot of Spanish Oaks Section VIII, which are receiving retail water and wastewater service from the LCRA/WTCPUA are summarized below:

The CCNG Parties are hereby providing written notice to the WTCPUA that a "Default" has occurred under the UFAA for: i) failing to notify CCNG Parties that the criteria from "an annual review of final tax appraisal values" has triggered the obligation to pay the CCNG Parties the thirty percent (30%) portion of the Reimbursable Costs and ii) failing to pay the CCNG Parties the remaining thirty percent (30%) portion of the Reimbursable Costs plus interest within thirty (30) days following the date the criteria for triggering the obligation to pay the CCNG Parties had occurred as required pursuant to Article X of the UFAA.

In addition, this letter represents the CCNG Parties "**Demand**" for the WTCPUA to pay the CCNG Parties the thirty percent (30%) portion of the Reimbursable Costs equal to \$581,021.37, as required pursuant to Article X of the UFAA.

We look forward to receiving your payment for the amounts due for the thirty percent (30%) portion of the Reimbursable Costs as outlined herein.

SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT FOR THE PROVISION OF NONSTANDARD RETAIL WATER AND WASTEWATER SERVICE (Lot 1, Block A, The Estates Center II Subdivision)

This Second Amendment to the Agreement for the Provision of Nonstandard Retail Water and Wastewater Service (the "Second Amendment") is entered into by and between the West Travis County Public Utility Agency (the "WTCPUA") a public utility agency operating pursuant to Chapter 572, Texas Local Government Code, and The Park at Bee Cave, Ltd, a Texas partnership (the "Developer").

WHEREAS, Developer and the WTCPUA entered into the Agreement for the Provision of Nonstandard Retail Water and Wastewater Service on November 1, 2013 (the "Agreement");

WHEREAS, the Developer and the WTCPUA entered into a First Amendment to the Agreement on February 20, 2014;

WHEREAS, Developer and the WTCPUA desire to enter into this Second Amendment to set forth additional terms and conditions upon which the WTCPUA will provide retail water and wastewater service to the Proposed Development; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms, conditions, and covenants contained in this Amendment, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are acknowledged, the Parties agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

1. Definition of Terms.

Section 1.1 is amended as follows:

(l) "Reservation Period" shall mean a four (4) year period commencing <u>on</u> at either the approval of a Site Development Permit by the City of Bee Cave for the Proposed Development, or February 14, 2018, whichever occurrence is earliest.

2. Reservation Fees.

The third paragraph of Section 4.2 is amended as follows:

For the initial year of the Reservation Period, (i) Reservation Fees for 93 LUEs of water and wastewater service have been paid and shall be paid not later than March 22, 2014 (ii) Of the 168 LUEs reserved under the Agreement, as amended, 136 LUEs for water and wastewater service remain unused. Reservation Fees for the remaining 229 136 unused LUEs for water and

¹ Bee Cave MOB Partners LLC (8 LUEs) and SCSD-Finnell, Ltd. (24 LUEs) are assignees under this agreement, but have connected LUEs and paid impact fees for service and no longer have any LUEs in reserved status.

Second Amendment – The Park at Bee Cave NSSA February 15, 2018

wastewater service applicable to the initial year of the Reservation Period shall be paid five (5) business days after approval of this Second Amendment by the WTCPUA Board not later than thirty (30) days from the earlier of either the approval of a Site Development Plan for the Proposed Development by the City of Bee Cave, or August 15, 2014. The initial year of the Reservation Period shall commence on February 15, 2014 for all 229 LUEs of water and wastewater service. The Reservation Fees which normally would be due on February 15, 2018 will be due five (5) business days after approval of this Second Amendment by the WTCPUA Board. Allocations for the 136 unused LUEs are as follows: The Park at Bee Cave, Ltd. – 29 LUEs; MVA-Bee Cave Realco, LLC (Unit G) – 80 LUEs; LG Bee Caves Holdings LLC (Unit C) – 8 LUEs; BF Bee Cave LLC (Unit E) – 5 LUEs; BCT MOB Partners (Unit D) – 14 LUEs.

Commencing in 2019, Reservation Fees for all unused LUEs of water and wastewater service shall be due on February 15 of each year.

3. Defined Terms.

All capitalized terms that are not otherwise defined herein shall have the meanings set forth in the Agreement.

4. Binding on Successors and Assigns

This Second Amendment is binding and applicable on all successors and assigns to the Agreement.

5. Effect on Agreement.

The terms of the Agreement are hereby modified and amended pursuant to the terms of this Amendment. Except as otherwise expressly amended by this Amendment, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement remain in full force and effect, and are hereby confirmed and ratified.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Parties hereto have executed this Amendment effective February 15, 2018.

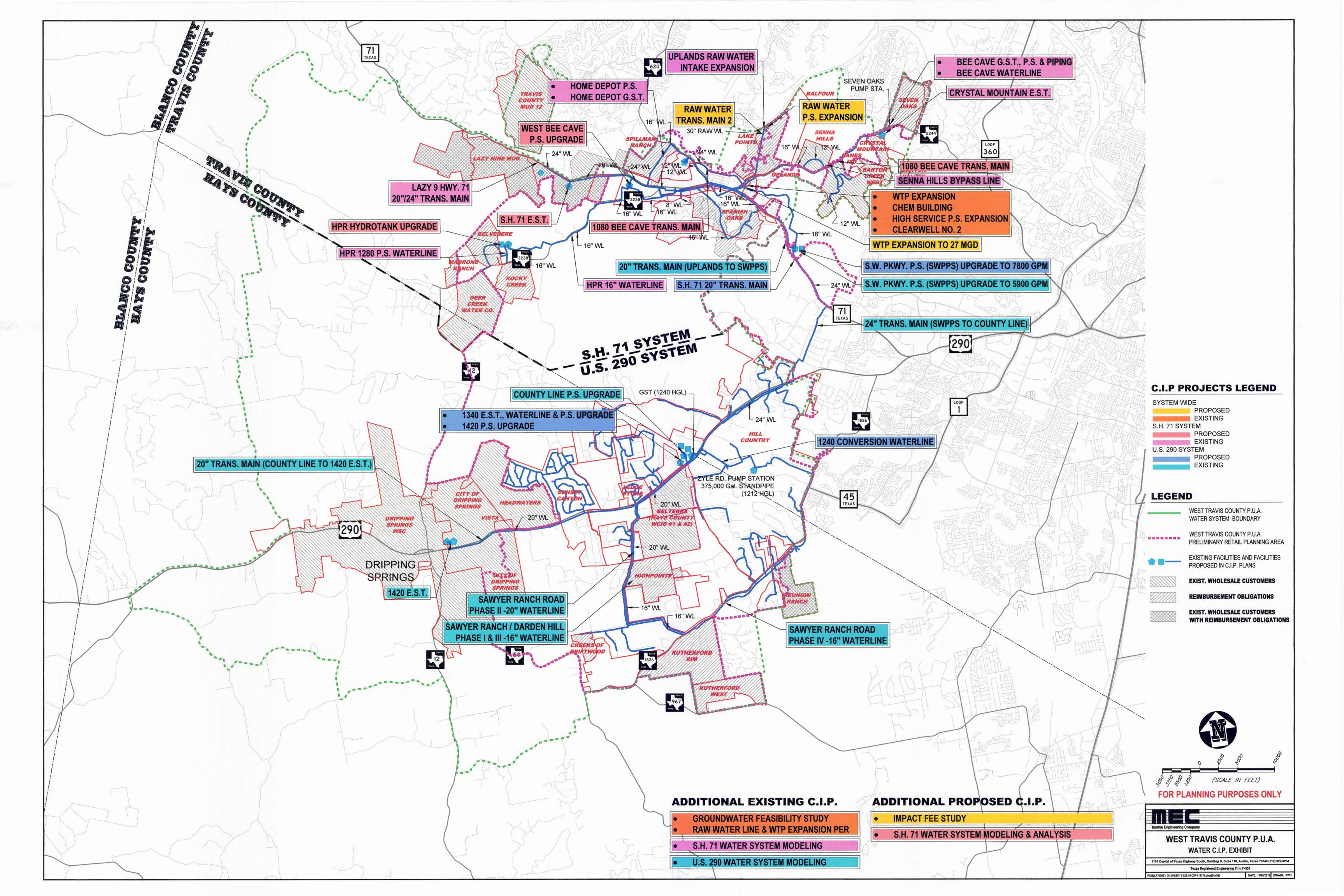

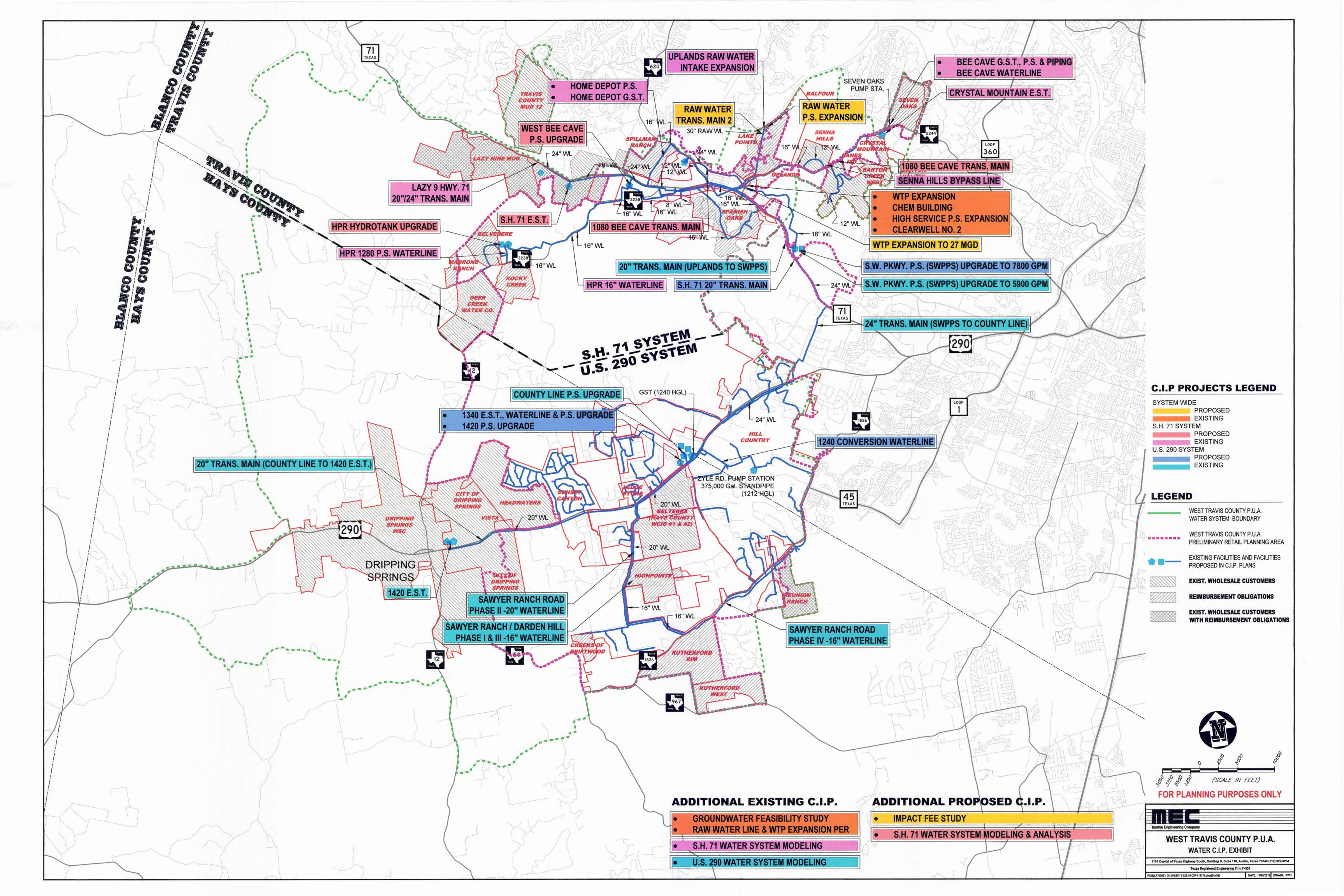

Please find the following status report for the active projects on which I am project manager that CP&Y(The Wallace Group) is currently working with you.

- 1. Lake Pointe WWTP Improvements The general contractor, PrimeSpec Constructors, completed installation of the new pump bases (2) and guiderail systems (2) in Plant #2 EQ on December 2, 2017. They installed the new sole plates for the vertical turbine effluent pump (#3 & #4) and also re-installed pump #3, which is now operational. Pump #2 is currently under construction to install the new pump base and will undergo vibration analysis and calibration during the week of February 12. Pump #2 will be placed into service once it passes all testing. Vibration analysis on pump #4 revealed an upper bearing problem and that pump is currently undergoing repair. Once pump #4 is repaired, installed and operating correctly, the Contractor will then proceed to install the remaining new pump base on pump #1. The chlorine contact basin new baffle walls and work is currently underway. Installation and coating of the new baffles walls and supports is complete and will be returned to operation the week of February 5. The new chlorination piping and diffuser will be installed at the same time, which will allow the basin and entire Plant #2 to be returned to operation. Due to weather and delays in fabricating and shipping the new mechanical bar screen, the project is projected to start up at the end of May 2018. The project's original startup date was April 11, 2018.
- 2. Tank & Pump Station Recoating Project (eight locations) This project began construction on December 4, 2017. The Contractor, CFG Industries, LLC located in Magnolia, Texas, completed work on the Dripping Springs elevated storage tank (EST) the week of January 29, 2017. They will begin work on the Crystal Mountain EST during the week of February 5, 2018. The project has a substantial completion date of September 12, 2018. The Contractor currently anticipates finishing construction by the end of June 2018.
- 3. Uplands WTP & High Service Pump Station Renovations This project began in December 2017 with the design team conducting site visits and beginning preliminary design efforts. The Engineer is currently awaiting review comments on the 30% project design and will subsequently proceed with completing 60% project design documents, thereafter, which will be submitted in March.

A written summary of all CIP projects that are currently underway is provided below with a tabular summary following.

Raw Water Line No. 2

A response to comments from the Southwest Region Office received was submitted and has been routed back through the local office to Albequerque. Draft design documents have been prepared and are being refined. Construction initiation is not practical for prior to the March 1st start of the Goldend-Cheeked Warbler nesting season, so the target for Notice to Proceed issuance has been moved to October.

Wastewater Permit Major Amendment

Administrative and preliminary technical comments have been received and are mostly non-substantive. A response will be submitted this month.

Beneficial Water Recycling Project

The sampling protocol is coming to a close and results are being catalogued and digitized as they are received. The analysis results lag a month or two so it will be the beginning of Q2 before the full source water characterization is complete. The design process is well underway and preliminary mechanical drawings have been completed and are under review along with cross-referencing between unit processes and equipment.

1340 Transmission Main

An agreement for the final pending easement is in negotiation. A Recommendation of Award is presented under a separate agenda item.

1340 Elevated Storage Tank

Initial submittals processing is underway and the contractor is making preparations for mobilization to the site.

Raw Water Intake Expansion and Rehabilitation

The project is in the submittal review process for long-lead equipment. Exploratory dives to investigate the condition of the existing intake screen were conducted and video has been analyzed in order to answer contractor questions.

Bohls WWTP Expansion Design

The site layout has been completed and site permit drawings are nearing completion. Individual unit processes have been analyzed with only aeration equipment remaining and we have begun detailed mechanical drawings for the individual components of the treatment works.

Southwest Parkway Pump Station Expansion

Coordination with the LCRA and The Nature Conservancy is ongoing and we are in the process of securing documentation to provide to the City of Austin that the Nature Conservancy acknowledges and consents to the inclusion of a portion of their property in our site plan application. The property will not be used for construction or included in the limits of construction for any purpose, but will remain an "undisturbed area" in perpetuity. A meeting to discuss tank type alternatives and geometry selection was held on February 7th and some additional information will be provided along with a final recommendation.

1080 Transmission Main

Using the recommended alternative alignment from the Preliminary Engineering Report, landowner information has been confirmed and updated and draft Right of Entry forms along with transmittal letters have been prepared for review to begin the easement identification and acquisition process. More in-depth subsurface utility information gathering is underway and additional field work is imminent to begin the detailed alignment establishment.

Home Depot Pump Station Rehabilitation

We have conducted site visits to catalog equipment and document the pump station in detail as well as reviewed original design drawings and all record information. Additionally, an operational strategy has been formulated and discussed with the electrical engineer. Pump alternatives selection is underway.

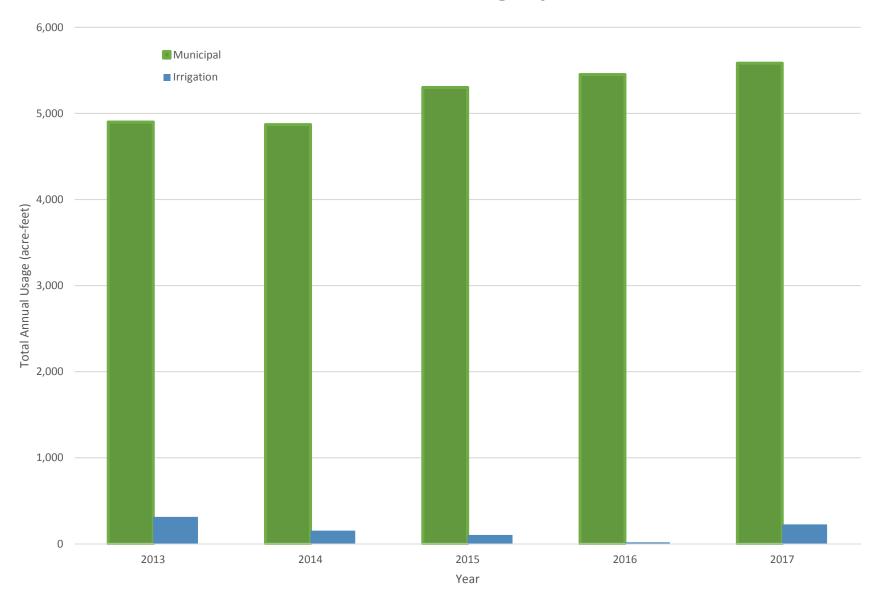

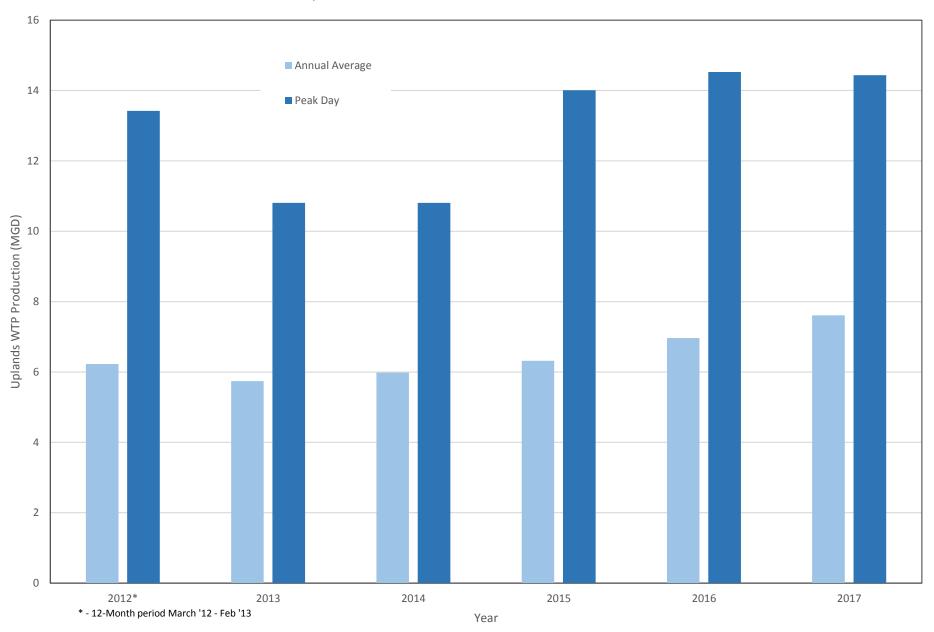

WTCPUA-Raw Water Usage by Contract

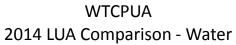


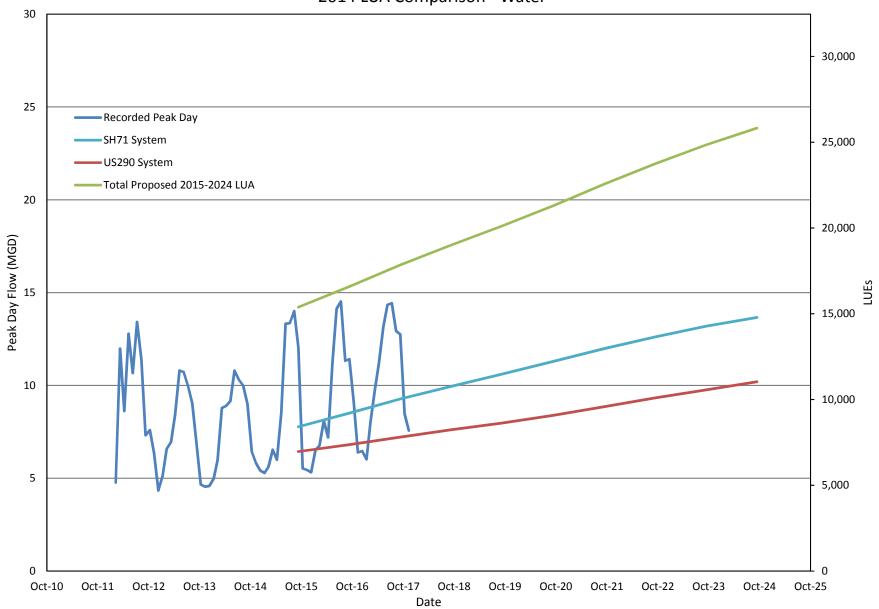

Uplands Water Treatment Plant Production



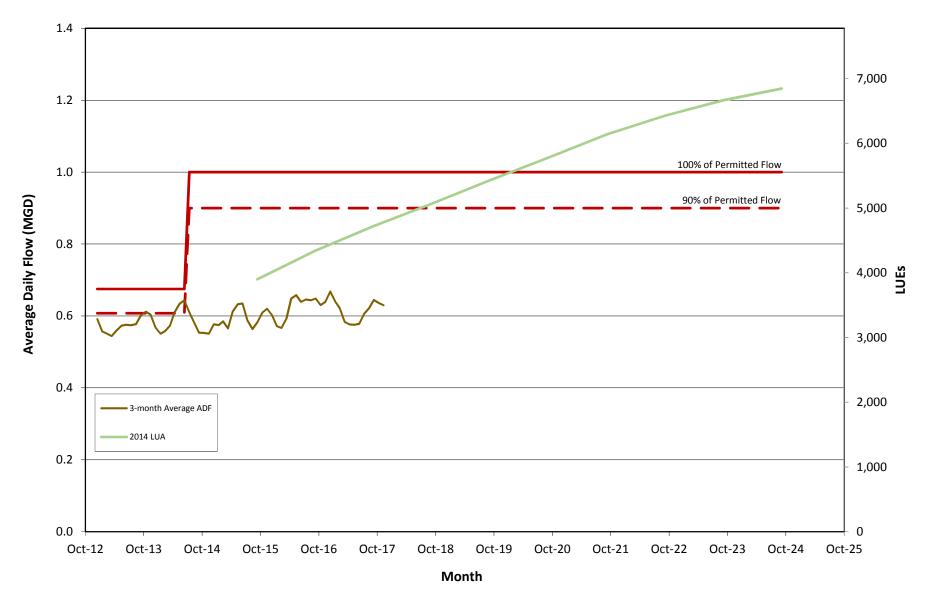

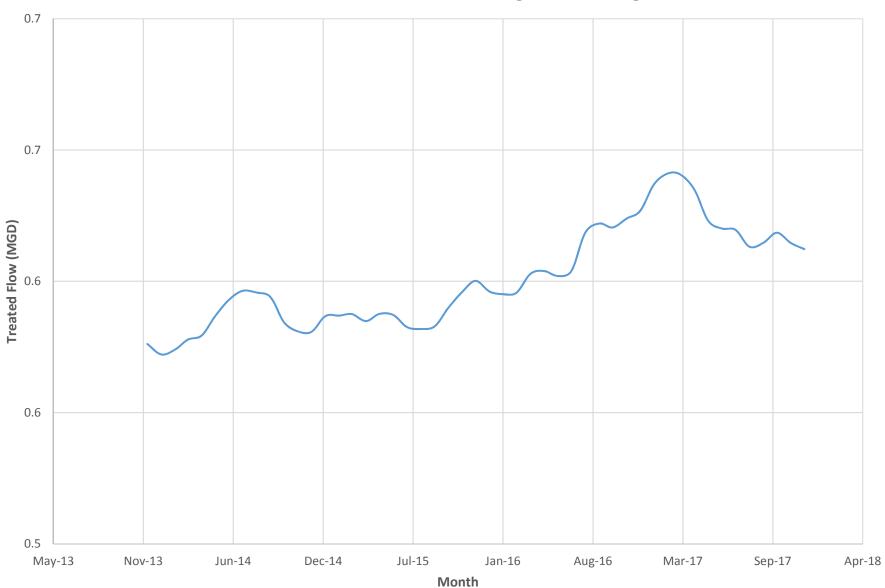

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VII. NEW BUSINESS

ITEM A

West Travis County Public Utility Agency Purchasing Policy

The West Travis County Public Utility Agency (Agency) establishes the following purchasing policy to ensure cost effective and efficient procurement of goods and services.

Before any purchases are made the General Manager or his designees shall ensure that, per the Agency's Budgeting Policy, proposed purchases are in accordance with approved budget line items. In all purchases, efforts should be made to obtain the best pricing and value for the Agency.

For contracts or purchases for goods, including equipment, materials and machinery over \$75,000, the Board shall require competitive sealed bids, advertise the letting of the contract or purchase, including the general conditions, time, and place of opening of sealed bids. Board approval is required before execution of any contracts.

For contracts or purchases for goods, including equipment, materials and machinery, over \$25,000 but not more than \$75,000, the Board shall solicit written competitive quotes on uniform written specifications from at least three vendors. Board approval is required before execution of any contracts.

For contracts or purchases for goods, including equipment, materials and machinery of not more than \$25,000, the Board is not required to advertise or seek competitive bids or quotes. The General Manager shall have the authority to make purchases of not more than \$25,000 without prior Board approval, provided purchases are made in accordance with the Agency's Budgeting Policy.

Purchase orders shall be required for purchases of goods or services greater than \$10,000 unless prior approval is obtained from the Agency's General Manager.

The above contract provisions do not apply to:

- (1) Equipment, materials, or machinery purchased by the Agency at an auction that is open to the public.
- (2) Contracts for personal or professional services or for a utility service operator.
- (3) Contracts for services or property for which there is only one source or for which it is otherwise impracticable to obtain competition.
- (4) High technology procurements.
- (5) Contracts for the purchase of electricity for use by the Agency.
- (6) Contracts for services related to compliance with a state or federal construction storm water requirement, including acquisition of permits, construction, repair, and removal of

temporary erosion control devices, cleaning of silt and debris from streets and storm sewers, monitoring of construction sites, and preparation and filing of all required reports.

(7) Purchases made through Buy Boards or similar purchasing cooperatives.

If changes in plans or specifications are necessary after the performance of a contract is begun, or if it is necessary to decrease or increase the quantity of the work to be performed or of the materials, equipment, or supplies to be furnished, change orders shall be approved as follows:

The General Manager or his designee shall have the authority to approve a change order that involves an increase or decrease of \$25,000 or less or less than 25% of the original contract price without prior Board approval. Change orders of more than \$25,000 or more than 25% of the original contract price shall require prior Board approval.

The Agency is not required to advertise or seek competitive bids for the repair of Agency facilities if the scope or extent of the repair work cannot be readily ascertained or if the nature of the repair work does not readily lend itself to competitive bidding.

The Agency is not required to advertise or seek competitive bids for security or surveillance systems or components of or additions to Agency facilities relating to security or surveillance, including systems used for the prevention of terrorist or criminal acts and incidents or acts of war, if the Board finds that doing so would compromise the safety and security of Agency facilities or residents.

If the Agency experiences an emergency condition that may create a serious health hazard or unreasonable economic loss to the Agency that requires immediate corrective action, the General Manager may negotiate limited duration contracts or make purchases without competitive bidding or obtaining three quotes to remedy the condition. The General Manager shall notify the Board promptly of the emergency and submit to the Board details describing the specific serious health hazard or unreasonable economic loss as soon as practicable following the issuance of the contracts. Whenever possible, the General Manager should obtain prior approval of the Board before authorizing the contract or purchases, but failure to obtain prior approval shall not void the contract or purchases.

Agency Management staff, as designated by the General Manager, shall have the authority to purchase goods or services up to \$5,000 without prior General Manager approval. The Operations Manager shall have the authority to purchase goods or services up to \$10,000 without prior General Manager approval. Purchases may be made by purchase order or credit card.

Agency Supervisory staff, as designated by the General Manager, shall have the authority to purchase goods or services up to \$2,500 without prior Agency Management staff approval and up to \$5,000 with prior Agency Management staff approval. Purchases may be made by purchase order or credit card.

Credit cards will only be issued to staff as approved by the General Manager. For all purchases made by credit card pursuant to this Purchasing Policy, receipts shall be provided to the Controller as soon as practicable following the purchase.

The General Manager or Controller may authorize the execution of revolving credit card or purchasing accounts for the purchase of regularly needed goods, materials, services, inventory or supplies per monthly line item budget limits. Items include but are not limited to:

- a. Chemicals.
- b. Utilities.
- c. Meters.
- d. Tools and field supplies.
- e. Office supplies.
- f. Janitorial services.
- g. Repair parts.

The General Manager or Management designees Controller or other Management staff as designated by the General Manager shall have the authority to approve recurringthe purchases of regularly needed goods, materials, services, inventory or supplies per purchasing policy guidelines and per monthly line item budget limits without prior Board approval.

In selecting attorneys, engineers, auditors, financial advisors, or other professional consultants, the Agency shall follow the procedures provided in Subchapter A, Chapter 2254, Government Code (Professional Services Procurement Act). Specifically, the Agency may not select a provider of professional services or a group or association of providers or award a contract for the services on the basis of competitive bids submitted for the contract or for the services, but shall make the selection and award:

- (1) On the basis of demonstrated competence and qualifications to perform the services.
- (2) For a fair and reasonable price.
- (3) The professional fees under the contract may not exceed any maximum provided by law.

A contract for technical, scientific, legal, fiscal, or other professional services must be approved by the Board unless specifically delegated by Board action. The terms and conditions of such a contract, including the terms for payment, are subject to the decision of the Board unless specifically delegated by Board action.

The General Manager or Controller may sign checks, or execute authorize electronic approved payments, or authorize payments through the Agency's online payment software for purchases equal to or less than the \$25,000 General Manager purchasing threshold in this Policy.

The General Manager or Controller may sign checks, or authorize execute electronic approved payments, or authorize payments through the Agency's online payment software for purchases

above the \$25,000 General Manager purchasing threshold in this Policy only after Board approval has been obtained. This \$25,000 check signing threshold may be exceeded for emergency conditions as outlined in this Purchasing Policy or for recurring the purchases of regularly needed goods, materials, services, inventory or supplies per purchasing policy guidelines and monthly line item budget limits.

Checks for all other purchases not included in the two preceding paragraphs shall be signed by two Board Members at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting. Checks above \$50,000 shall have two signatures of either the General Manager, Controller or Board Members.

The Controller is authorized to make inter-fund transfers between Agency bank accounts<u>and to execute make wire transfers for bond payments</u>, investment policy transactions or equivalent distributions. or payments pursuant to bond closing documents.

A check register detailing all payments made by the Agency and all invoices for purchases which require Board approval, and other invoices requested by the Board, will be provided to the Board at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting. Payments requiring Board approval shall be included on the consent agenda for such approval.

SUBJECT: Aged Meter Policy and AMR Meter Saturation Program

DATE: February 15, 2018

The PUA has approximately 7700 residential water meters in its service area, with 4525 being automatic read meters (AMR), and 3175 being manual read meters. AMR meters are read efficiently when a truck drives by and the register transmitter sends the read via signal to the receiving laptop. Manual meters are read when meter readers code the register dial read into a laptop, which takes considerably more time. LCRA started installing AMR meters in 2004 for new installations and replacements, which has been the standard meter to the present time. The existing manual meters consist of several brands that are quite old with an estimated average age of 15 years.

The PUA currently does not have an aged meter changeout policy, which is typically a core function of every water utility. AWWA and water industry publications state that meters should be replaced between ten and twenty years, depending on the type of meter, consumption, and water quality. Meter testing data exhibits that meters can maintain accuracy of 98% at 10 years and 4,000,000 gallons of usage. Other publications advise that the optimum time to replace meters is 15 years due to the beginning of declining accuracy, which affects water revenue.

Accordingly, we recommend that the PUA adopt 15 years as an aged meter replacement policy going forward. AMR meters have a 15-year AWWA M6 accuracy warranty up to 2.5M gallons, and 25-year housing warranty. Registers, which contain transmitters and batteries for sending meter read signals and data log retrieval, have a 20-year warranty with replacement in the first ten years being covered at 100%, and

replacement from 10 to 20 years being pro-rated. Batteries can fail at less than the 15-year aged meter replacement time frame, which requires register replacement, but we feel this can be completed on a case by case basis when required.

The table below shows the total number and age of AMR meters in our service territory, and recommended year of replacement based on a 15-year aged meter replacement policy. It is assumed that meter replacements would be completed by inhouse staff:

Further, it is also recommended that the 3175 manual read meters be replaced with AMR meters over a three-year period to address the age of these meters, reduce meter reading costs, provide additional staff resources for other needs and provide data log capability for all our customers. The estimated meter cost and labor replacement cost are \$250 and \$100, respectively, resulting in a cost of \$370,416 per year. Alternatively, an AMR meter saturation plan completed over five years would cost \$222,250 per year. Assuming 12 monthly manual reads of each meter per year at 5 minutes per read (including parking and walking to and from the meter), the labor cost savings alone would be \$85,725 per year, not to mention fuel savings. This assumes a fully burdened, single meter reader labor rate of \$27 per hour. This replacement project would be advertised, bid and awarded to a private contractor. Funding would be budgeted and paid for from the PUA facilities fund.
